Participants will receive a Farmers First Aid book and materials that will assist with creating or updating your farms emergency action plan.

Emily Beck, conservation specialist at MFA Inc. will be discussing the effects of droughts and excessive rain on soil and crops, as well as what you need to look out for after an extreme weather event.

Retrofitting older tractors with ROPs and using a seat belt can prevent 99% of roll-over fatalities. This presentation will provide information on the cost to farmers of agricultural injuries and illness and low-cost solutions for prevention. Ellen Duysen a Research Assistant Professor working at the Central States Center for Agricultural Safety and Health will discuss the importance of adding safety to your farms risk management plan. Participants will leave with an armload of personal protective equipment and safety information.
